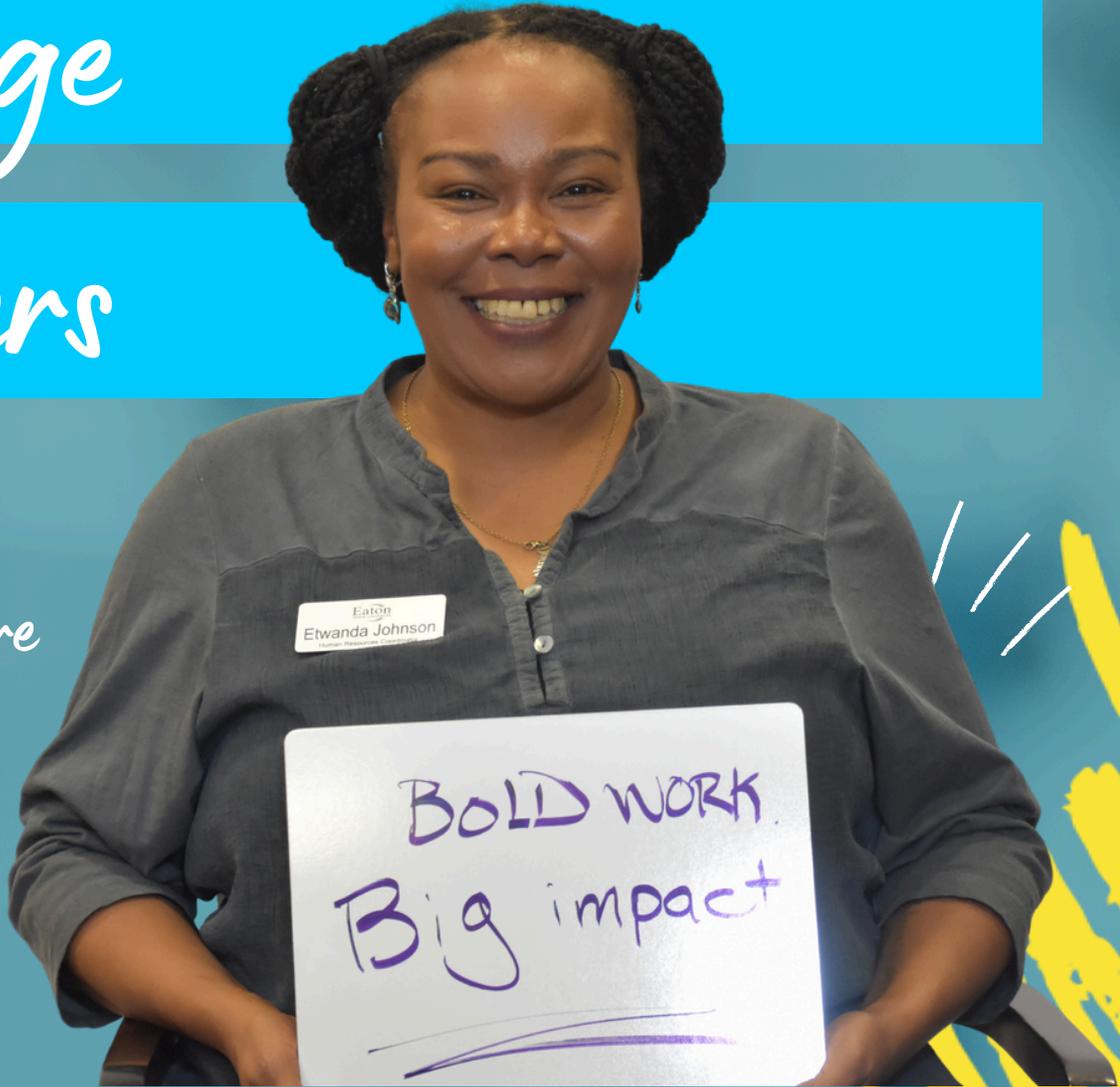

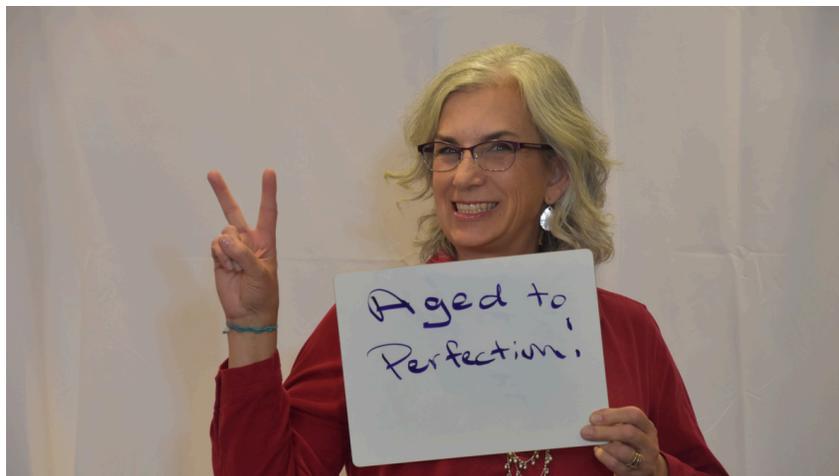

In this session, Jordan Barry shares how Kavod developed, refined, and uses its data dashboard to track key performance indicators (KPIs), spot patterns, identify issues early, and drive meaningful action — all without needing a dedicated data team or complex technology.

Colorado's long-term care workforce shortage demands creative solutions — and JAWS is delivering one.

Students say it best: the highlight is always the relationships they build with residents and staff. Using real case studies, the panel shows how connecting clinical, dietary, behavioral, social, and pharmaceutical insights helps teams identify risks early, design effective Performance Improvement Projects, and prevent repeat deficiencies.

Attendees will leave with a practical five-step IDT framework — plus ready-to-use tools including an IDT Integration Checklist, QAPI Data Mapping Template, and PIP Planning Worksheet.

Every leader has insecurities. The ones who don't let them run the show are the ones who change things.

This honest, impactful session examines how personal insecurities quietly shape leadership decisions, communication styles, and organizational culture — often without us even realizing it. Through relatable stories, practical psychology, and guided reflection, Cindy Tanner helps leaders identify their insecurity triggers and interrupt the patterns before they do damage.

Using short reflective exercises, live demonstrations, and a rapid In/Security Reaction Tool, this highly interactive session gives leaders immediately usable skills to respond rather than react — and to lead with clarity, transparency, and influence.

Session 203 PR Preparedness: How to Be Ready Before the Headlines Hit

In today's digital world, a single incident can become a headline before you've had a chance to respond. For senior living operators, that headline can shape public perception for years.

This session equips leaders with a proactive public relations strategy — so when a crisis hits, you're leading with confidence instead of scrambling to catch up. Through real-world case studies and interactive exercises, you'll learn how to identify vulnerabilities, craft clear and empathetic messaging, and establish rapid-response protocols before you ever need them.

Session 301 The Age of Change: Defying the Fall — Rethinking Frailty and Fall Prevention in Aging **Jeffrey Guild | Optimize Physical Therapy & Wellness**

Falls are not inevitable. Frailty is not a fate. It's time to stop accepting decline as the default.

This energizing session challenges the outdated mindset that aging means inevitable physical decline — and gives senior living leaders the tools to build a culture where strength, balance, and vitality are the norm. Jeffrey Guild makes the case that two powerful, evidence-backed levers are within every organization's control: strength and balance training, and early frailty intervention.

The science is clear: combined strength and balance training is the single most effective intervention for reducing falls — outperforming every other commonly used approach. And frailty, often dismissed as abstract, is actually a measurable, controllable condition with warning signs that can be spotted months in advance.

Session 302 Enhancing Employee Experience to Drive Retention **Robert Baker & Jenna Correia | Covenant Living of Colorado**

What does it actually take to make employees feel valued — and what happens to retention when you get it right?

Covenant Living of Colorado achieved the best year-over-year improvement in employee satisfaction across their entire 20-campus national organization in 2025. In this session, Robert Baker and Jenna Correia share three years of employee satisfaction data alongside the practical, people-first strategies that moved the needle.

From daily leadership huddles and revamped all-staff meetings to skip-level interviews and Sunshine Carts, their approach focuses on building a culture where connection, recognition, and transparency aren't just values on a wall — they're daily practices.

Session 303 Stop the Drip: Reclaim the Revenue You Didn't Know You Lost **Mindy Whitworth | Bethesda Senior Living**

Most senior living communities are losing 9–12% of annual revenue — not to market conditions, but to everyday internal processes that have gone unexamined for years.

Revenue leakage hides in plain sight: inconsistent sales follow-up, emotional discounting, delayed room readiness, under-coded care levels, unbilled services, and billing errors. In this session, Mindy Whitworth brings a provider-centered lens to one of the industry's least-discussed financial challenges — and delivers a practical framework to fix it.

Using real operational scenarios from across nonprofit and for-profit communities, attendees will work through a repeatable five-step model — See → Measure → Align → Execute → Sustain — to diagnose and correct leaks without adding staff or increasing marketing spend.

The session also spotlights the Executive Director's critical and often underutilized role as a revenue leader, with concrete examples of how ED engagement in the sales process improves conversion, shortens the sales cycle, and strengthens rate integrity.

Session 401 AI in Senior Living: Real Wins, Real Risks, and a Live Safe-Use Demo **Steven VanderVelde | ProviNET Solutions**

AI is already transforming senior living operations — but are your teams using it safely?

This practical, non-technical session cuts through the hype to deliver what leaders actually need: real examples of AI working in senior living today, an honest look at the risks, and a live demonstration of safe, high-impact workflows you can start using immediately.

From operations and clinical support to HR, finance, and resident engagement, Steven VanderVelde shows where AI is delivering real results — then tackles the risks that don't get enough attention: deepfakes, hyper-personalized phishing, policy pitfalls, and the dangers of overreliance on AI outputs.

The session closes with a 20-minute live demo featuring prompt patterns, redaction techniques, and human-in-the-loop checks your team can put to work right away.

Session 402 Psychological Safety as a Changemaker **Vennita Jenkins | Senior Housing Options**

What if the single most powerful thing you could do for quality care, staff retention, and regulatory compliance was simply making it safe for people to speak up?

Psychological safety isn't a soft concept — it's a proven driver of team performance, resident well-being, and organizational resilience. In high-stress, highly regulated environments like senior living and home- and community-based services, the ability of staff to raise concerns without fear directly impacts outcomes at every level.

In this session, Vennita Jenkins guides participants through a research-based Four Stages Model of psychological safety — Inclusion, Learner, Contributor, and Challenger — using real-world examples from housing, assisted living, and interdisciplinary care teams. You'll learn how leaders at every level can shift culture through small, consistent behaviors that add up to transformational change.

Session 403 The Changing Senior Living Consumer **Jessica Ruhle | Creating Results**

By 2030, every Baby Boomer will be over 65 — and they won't choose a senior living community the way their parents did.

Today's 65+ adults are working longer, living more diverse lifestyles, and expecting experiences that match their ambitions. Traditional marketing and sales approaches built around older assumptions about aging are losing their effectiveness — and communities that don't adapt will feel it in their occupancy numbers.

In this session, Jessica Ruhle unpacks the shifting behaviors and expectations of tomorrow's senior living consumer and shows you how to evolve your marketing and sales strategies to meet them where they are.
